Monthly Meeting Minutes

April 8, 2020

The Ocean Highway and Port Authority of Nassau County held its Monthly Meeting on Wednesday, April 8, 2020 via teleconference call.

The meeting was called to order at 6:02 PM by Chairman Danny Fullwood.

The invocation was given and Pledge of Allegiance was led by Commissioner Hanna. Roll call was conducted by Ms. Barbara Amergian. All Commissioners were present. Also in attendance via the teleconference call was Jeb Branham, Port Attorney; Pierre LaPorte, Port Accountant; Chris Ragucci, Port Director/Port Operator.

Commissioner Franklin made the motion to accept the February 12, 2020 monthly meeting minutes. Motion seconded by Commissioner Cole. The motion is approved unanimously with no discussion.

Port Accountant Pierre LaPorte presented the March 2020 financials and the 1st Quarter 2019-2020 Report to the Board. The March financials showed a payment of \$20,973 from Worldwide and he noted that the \$850 in discretionary funds had been spent on the Tradeplex sign survey. Mr. LaPorte informed the Board that he will be distributing the audited financials at the next monthly meeting.

Port Attorney Jeb Branham presented his monthly report. Mr. Branham reminded the Board that the mediation date for the PILOT payment issue with the City of Fernandina was scheduled for June 3, 2020. Mediation statements by both parties have been submitted to the Mediator and the statements have been sent to the Board members for review. He informed the Board that he had made some changes to Channel Re-alignment and had sent those to Commissioner Sturgess for review. Mr. Branham had confirmed with Customs and Board Protection that improvements to the Customs House could be made as necessary and that OHPA could proceed with signing the new lease.

Commissioner Hanna made the motion to authorized Commissioner Franklin to execute the new lease for the Customs House. Commissioner Franklin seconded. Motion was passed unanimously. Commissioner Sturgess asked for a poll of the vote due to the teleconference.

Cole YES Franklin YES Fullwood YES Hanna YES Sturgess YES Port Operator Chris Ragucci apprised the Board of the challenges and potential opportunities for the Port of Fernandina which include hosting cruise ships that need a berthing spot and accepting overflow of containers when larger ports in the area are unable to accommodate due to the backup during the pandemic. Mr. Ragucci presented the March, 2020 tonnage report. Commissioner Franklin asked about precautions for the docked ship's crews during the pandemic and Mr. Ragucci reported that the crews are quarantined onboard the vessels. Mr. Ragucci informed the Board that Worldwide is in negotiations with a wood pulp importer from Europe and this would be a new long-term customer. Mr. Ragucci reported that the dredging project was 80% complete with depths up to 40' at the berth. He anticipates that the project will be completed by the end of the month.

Unfinished Business

Attorney Branham addressed the Custom House lease and deficiencies in his report earlier in the meeting. Commissioner Franklin reminded the Board that this is the last month that OHPA will receive a rent payment from the GSA. He asked Mr. Ragucci to take over the utility payments and monthly cleaning bill. Mr. Ragucci said he would look into the expenses and consider.

There was discussion regarding the monies due from Worldwide Terminals to the Ocean Highway and Port Authority. Mr. Ragucci informed the Board that an Allied Security payment check has been mailed to OHPA in the amount of \$8,170.24. Worldwide would be issuing a payment check on Friday (April 10) for a 1/12th quarterly payment (\$20,973) to OHPA. Mr. Ragucci told the Board that a line of credit had been applied for and was approved last month but the loan was cancelled due to COVID 19. He also informed the Board that Worldwide had applied for a Paycheck Protection loan and some of those funds would be used to catch up on quarterly payments – he is awaiting approval from the Bank on his loan request. Attorney Branham brought up the issue of getting correct instructions to the Bond Trustee and the need for the Borrower (Worldwide Terminals) to provide the Bond Trustee (Zion Bank) with complete and accurate payment instructions. Currently the instructions only instruct for quarterly payments and do not include monthly maintenance payments nor the anticipated PILOT payments. The Bond Trustee has taken the position that documents are necessary from Worldwide to release funds in the Issuer's (OHPA) account. There was discussion and Commissioner Sturgess requested that Attorney Branham send out a letter outlining the points in dispute to all in an effort to work on the payment issues together.

Commissioner Franklin made the motion to ask Attorney Branham to investigate the default of Worldwide Terminals for non-payment. Commission Hanna seconded the motion. Discussion followed. Motion withdrawn.

Commissioner Sturgess made the motion to take the issue up again once both sides has submitted their positions in writing. Motion withdrawn.

Attorney Branham requested that Mr. Ragucci send him a copy of the instructions that were sent to the Bond Trustee in March 2020. Mr. Ragucci said that he did not think there would be an objection to that.

Chairman Fullwood made the motion to replace Mr. Ragucci as the Port Director if monies owed to OHPA and are not paid either through the Bond Trustee or other available funds to bring the account with OHPA current within thirty (30) days. Motion passes unanimously.

Chairman Fullwood made the motion to accept the new Port logo. Commissioner Hanna seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Chairman Franklin made the motion to accept Resolution 2020-R03. A RESOLUTION OF THE OCEAN HIGHWAY AND PORT AUTHORITY OF NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING THE ENTRY INTO A PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION GRANT AGREEMENT WITH THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR FUNDING FOR PLANNING INITIATIVES, INCLUDING MASTER AND STRATEGIC PLANNING; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. Motion passed unanimously.

New Business

Rick Ferrin of TranSystems was in attendance on the teleconference and brought to the Board's attention that Worldwide Terminals is currently past due on three projects in the amount of \$184,662. Commissioner Cole asked Port Attorney Branham if OHPA is ultimately responsible for these amounts as the contract is between OHPA and TranSystems. Because OHPA is the contracting party, yes and Worldwide would be party to any lawsuit that would be filed. Mr. Ragucci stated that Worldwide would be dealing with this issue directly with TranSystems and will make sure they do their best to deal with it in a way that does not impact OHPA. Chairman Fullwood asked that the issue be worked out before next month's meeting.

- Customs House Commissioner Franklin Northing new to report outside of the GSA rental payments, lease and deficiencies already addressed earlier in the meeting. Port Accountant LaPorte will send Mr. Ragucci the monthly expenses for review and consideration.
- Army Corp of Engineers Commissioner Sturgess The maintenance dredging of the channel is on track. An updated survey of the channel has been complete with work expected to start in December.
- Economic Development Commissioner Cole Nothing new to report.
- Emergency Management Commissioner Franklin There was information on beach closings and the COVID19 outbreak in Nassau County.
- Technical Coordinating Committee Commissioner Hanna -
- TPO Commissioner Cole Commissioner Cole -
- Nassau Chamber East Side Commissioner Sturgess there was no meeting held but the Chamber is working to keep businesses updated with information.
- Nassau Chamber West Side Commissioner Cole- Nothing new to report.

With no other business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 8:46 PM.

Management is responsible for the accompanying financial statements of the Ocean High and Port Authority of Nassau County (a not for profit Special District chartered by the Legislature of the State of Florida), which comprise the balance sheet as of March 31, 2020, March 31, 2019 and December 31, 2019 and the related statement of income and retained earnings for one quarter ended and two quarters ended March 31, 2020 and one quarter ended March 31, 2019, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We have performed a compilation engagement in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services promulgated by the Accounting and Review Services Committee of the AICPA. We did not audit or review the financial statements nor were we required to perform any procedures to verify the accuracy or completeness of the information provided by management. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion, a conclusion, nor provide any form of assurance on these financial statements.

A statement of cash flows for the quarter ended March 31, 2020, March 31, 2019 and December 31, 2019, has not been presented. Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that such a statement be presented when financial statements purport to present financial position and results of operations.

Management has elected to omit substantially all of the disclosures required by generally accepted accounting principles. If the omitted disclosures were included in the financial statements, they might influence the user's conclusions about the Ocean Highway and Port Authority's financial position. Accordingly, these financial statements are not designed for those who are not informed about such matters.

Below are updates on the near-term legal issues:

- 1. We are still holding June 3, 2020 for mediation for the next phase of the dispute resolutions proceedings to resolve the dispute with Fernandina Beach regarding the end date for the PILOT payments. Executive Order 20-112 (Phase 1. Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step. Plan for Florida's Recovery) currently controls public gathering restrictions and remains in force until it is rescinded. Section 2(C)(1) of this Order says "Avoid congregating in large groups. Local jurisdictions shall ensure that groups of people greater than ten are not permitted to congregate in any public space that does not readily allow for appropriate physical distancing." Executive Order 20-69 that allows virtual public meetings remains in effect indefinitely under EO 20-112. We should discuss whether we prefer to delay mediation again, find a space that would allow for 25 or so people to attend while appropriately distanced, or make preparations to conduct the mediation virtually as a back-up plan.
- 2. Commissioner Sturgess and I have finished OHPA's revisions to the interlocal agreement with the City of Fernandina Beach to assume financial liability associated with the westward channel realignment. A copy is attached. With commission approval, we can transmit it to Fernandina Beach for its consideration.

RE: Past Due Balances Owed to TranSystems

Dear Chairman Fullwood:

As you might be aware, TranSystems Corporation (TranSystems) provides consulting engineering services to the Ocean Highway and Port Authority (OHPA) pursuant to a June 29, 2019 Professional Services Continuing Contract. Currently TranSystems has two separate projects with OHPA issued under separate task orders, both of which have become seriously delinquent. A brief summary of the two projects is as follows:

<u>P309180095 - Pier Access Bridge Inspection and Design:</u> Following an initial structural inspection and analysis of the main wharf, the project was later amended to include a load analysis for the new mobile harbor crane, another load analysis to determine the adequacy of the wharf's capacity to secure larger vessels and the preparation of design and bid documents for wharf repairs and additions and the demolition, removal and replacement of a reinforced concrete transition apron between the wharf and cargo yard. After completing the bid solicitation, accepting a single bid and repeatedly attempting to value engineer the project to meet OHPA's budget, TranSystems was informed by the OHPA Port Director, Christopher Ragucci, that OHPA did not have sufficient funds to complete the Project or pay TranSystems for the work performed. This project is funded at 75% by FDOT under an FSTED grant from the state. Only 25% of the cost is the responsibility of the local sponsor – OHPA.

P309190040 – Warehouse Design Criteria Package: In August of 2019 TranSystems entered into a contract with OHPA to prepare a design-criteria package for a new 29,000 s.f. forest products warehouse to be located adjacent to the Nassau Terminals wharf on the main marine terminal. TranSystems completed the design criteria package in January, and provided the design criteria package, project specifications and instructions to bidders in a request for proposals to two qualified contractors for competitive proposals. To locate the warehouse building where OHPA directed would require an expensive pile-foundation design, and after receiving bids for the work, and Mr. Ragucci has inquired about investigating a new site for the Warehouse on a site off the main terminal that the OHPA does not currently own. Mr.



Ragucci has conditioned payment for work completed thus far by TranSystems since September 2019 on a modification of the original contract by TranSystems, committing to develop a new design criteria package and solicit proposals from qualified contractors for the development of an new warehouse on the property off the terminal, south of the existing warehouse complex and to the east of the rail line on a piece of private property not currently owned by the Port Authority. This project is funded at 37% by FDOT under an FSTED grant from the state. The remaining 63% is to come from the local sponsor and would be paid from Worldwide Terminals' municipal bond funds.

Following the last payment from OHPA in July 2019 for an April 2019 invoice, TranSystems has been continuing work on both Projects, now under the direction of Mr. Ragucci since his being appointed by OHPA's Board to be their Port Director on December 11, 2019. Despite assurances by Mr. Ragucci and offers to make partial payments of the amounts outstanding, Mr. Ragucci has failed to take any meaningful measures to pay the delinquent balances. The current outstanding balances owed for the projects is as follows:

In accordance with section 5.5 of the agreement between TranSystems and OHPA, effectively immediately TranSystems is suspending all further services with OHPA and withholding any further deliverables until all amounts outstanding have been paid in full, including all expenses and charges. Further, all outstanding balances owed will be assessed interest at a rate of 1.5% per month. In the event we are required to proceed with collection on this matter, in accordance with the agreement we will pursue all attorney's fees and costs associated with our collection efforts. A summary of the outstanding invoices is attached.

Given our failed efforts to date to resolve the outstanding amounts owed TranSystems with Mr. Ragucci, we are directing this to your attention and request you share with the other OHPA Commissioners. We will also copy your counsel, Mr. Branham. Please contact me directly if you wish to discuss resolving this matter in an amicable fashion.

Good Afternoon All,

I have attached two documents for all of your use this evening at the meeting during the discussion of Worldwide's outstanding payables. I have also attached this month's Tonnage Report for discussion.

The first document is the **Schedule of Monies Owed**. This was prepared by Barb, and is included on page 25 of your Board packet. I have simply highlighted a couple of items on it for purposes of our discussion tonight.

The second document is a brief summary prepared by Rhonda Poteat, our Controller, recapping the amounts that Worldwide has paid out on OHPA projects since we took over in February 2018. As you will see, most of the payments relate to the current dredging project, for which Worldwide has already paid out \$70,069.10 to date. Worldwide had previously paid out \$57,000 as the final payment on the Fender Project started under Kinder Morgan. These payments alone represent a total of \$127,069.10. This *exclusive of* day to day maintenance performed on OHPA's port facilities, which is easily over another \$100,000.

I understand that Pierre LaPorte has previously discussed our proposal with each of you prior to tonight's meeting.

Tonight we will be requesting a Motion that has 3 principal elements:

- OHPA agrees to accept immediate payment of \$175,000.00 as payment in full for all quarterly payments currently outstanding under the Operating Agreement. The outstanding amount, through June 30th is \$188,756.25. We will be taking care of all outstanding quarterly payments and in effect pre-paying the month of June.
- 2. In recognition that the \$5,000 monthly payment into the "Maintenance Fund" is purely for the purpose of funding maintenance projects and OHPA's local matching share of Capital Projects contributed to by the State of Florida, OHPA will recognize that the currently outstanding months totaling \$55,000, along with the remaining months through December 31st of this year will be not be considered due, but will be allocated toward the Fender Project and the Dredging project. This is entirely consistent with the purposes of this fund as set forth in the Operating Agreement and with the customary way projects have been handled making use of this fund to cover OHPA's local share for projects.
- The Chairman and Secretary will be authorized to execute the appropriate Resolution to codify the above, and will issue to Worldwide a Certificate of Good Standing in connection with the Operating Agreement through June 30, 2020.

Thank you all for your consideration of the foregoing and we look forward to a good discussion this evening and to answering any questions you may have.
